**MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
DOE VALLEY ASSOCIATION, INC.**

Monday 26, September 2011
5 p.m. At the Doe Valley Admin Office

Members present: Stuart Pepper, Bill Hofmann, Bob Beyerlein, Mark Filburn, and Ken Wilson, General Manager.

The first order of business was to appoint a Temporary President in the absence of Steve Blaske who resigned because of health reasons two weeks ago. Bill Hofmann nominated Bob Beyerlein, Mark Filburn 2nd, the vote was 3 yes, Stuart Pepper voted no; motion carried.

Bob established a quorum and called for an acceptance of the minutes from the previous meeting. Bill made a motion to accept the minutes, Mark 2nd, motion carried.

The financials were presented by Ken due to Patsy being absent. They were e-mailed to everyone for review. If anyone has a particular question or concern, call Patsy and schedule an appointment. Overall we ended the month of September \$63,000 to the good, the Marina is down due to all the dock parts that we had to purchase. The road fund received a deposit in July of \$54,000 but the accrual basis summary doesn't indicate that. Utilities also did a little better this month but water leaks have been on the rise of late and we will probably see it reflected next month. Expect sewer expenses to increase with the maintenance that is scheduled for the rest of the year and will continue into 2012. Bill made a motion to accept the financials, Stuart 2nd, motion carried.

Bob made a motion to appoint Greg Hurt as replacement Board member for Steve Blaske and to finish his term; Bill 2nd, motion carried unanimously. Greg joined the Board meeting via phone conference.

Bob announced the next order of business is the appointment of Officers for this term. Mark made a motion to appoint two Vice Presidents, one for financial and one for operations. Bob 2nd, motion carried. Bill made a motion to nominate Bob Beyerlein for President, Mark 2nd, 4 yes votes, Stuart voted no. For Vice President of Financials Mark made a motion to nominate Bill Hofmann, Mark 2nd, motion carried unanimously. For Vice President of Operations Stuart made motion to nominate Mark Filburn, Greg 2nd, motion carried. For Treasurer Mark made motion to nominate Bill Hofmann, Bob 2nd, motion carried. For Secretary Mark made a motion to nominate Greg Hurt, Bill 2nd, motion carried.

Jessica Brown Roberts, The Meade County Attorney, was invited to attend the meeting to clarify our position in regards to Security and the law. The first question was *"with regards to the rules and regulations of DV giving the Sheriff's Office permission to enforce traffic rules in DV and the letter from the KACo (Kentucky Association of Counties) attorney sufficient for us to allow the Sheriff to provide traffic enforcement in DV?"* Ms. Roberts replied "yes". Mark also asked if we decided to employ secondary enforcement by the Sheriff after hours would that be covered? Ms. Roberts replied "yes". She suggested that DV should write up a contract to the effect of what the hourly wage would be and what the duties would entail. Mark asked would the State Police also need a contract to provide traffic services here; she replied "yes it would probably be a good idea". Blue lights on vehicles were brought up and Ms. Roberts said that use was restricted by State Statues and Security does not fall under that. Green and white lights are fine for DV Security. Ken and Carl verified that we already have green and white lights. Ms. Roberts said that basically our Security can do non-police functions and things that are unique to DV such as parking, trespassing, member assistance and generally observe any suspicious activity. If they are in doubt of safety or concern for the residents, they are to call for County assistance.

Manager's report:

1. Paving is complete for now but a few more spots may be worked on before the asphalt plants close. DV will continue to do some of the repairs as well.
2. Docks are nearing completion.
3. Golf greens were aerated last week.
4. Irrigation system was installed also last week on the front entrance.
5. A fire hydrant was replaced last week after failure of the old one.

Board Minutes continued

Member reports:

Mark: Security has 5 critical areas:

1. Discontinue duties not allowed by law.
2. Overstaffing
3. Budget
4. Training
5. Supervision

Mark discussed the need for overall improvement and working with the Security Manager to achieve the goals necessary to provide the service we want in DV. Discussion followed about what the attorney said earlier, what are the steps we need to take first, qualifications of current employees, etc. Bob suggested we table this until the next meeting and then compile ideas and work from there after everyone has time to think about it; all agreed to table the issue.

Bill asked about the utility gate being open so much. Ken said it will be closed from now on except when deliveries are made. Greg asked about Bellemeade gate and Ken said it is closed as well; Security will coordinate with contractors about when they need to come in and out, securing the gate after each time. Bill also asked that we devote part of the Budget meeting next month to the utility side and find a way to offset the losses. Everyone agreed.

No other member reports.

Old business: 1. By-law changes: Ken said the By-law changes have been made in the draft copy and asked that the Board move ahead. Stuart made a motion to present the changes to the membership for approval; Bob 2nd, discussion followed from Bill about a couple of points. Stuart made motion to accept the By-law changes as presented; Bob 2nd. Bill asked for a clarification of several items. Discussion followed, the areas were addressed and the original motion to approve the By-laws were voted upon, motion carried.

New Business: A member made a complaint about a structure in DV and the affect it has had on his way of life. Our rules state that anything considered a nuisance to a neighbor is against the rules. The owner has agreed to try several ways to reduce the affect on other members and for now we are waiting for the results. The Board will hold any decision until the outcome of the tests are known.

Mark suggested for all Supervisors submit their budget; Ken said they have already been tasked.

Stuart made a motion to adjourn, Bob 2nd, meeting adjourned.

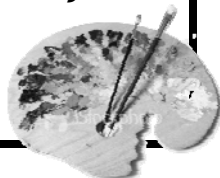

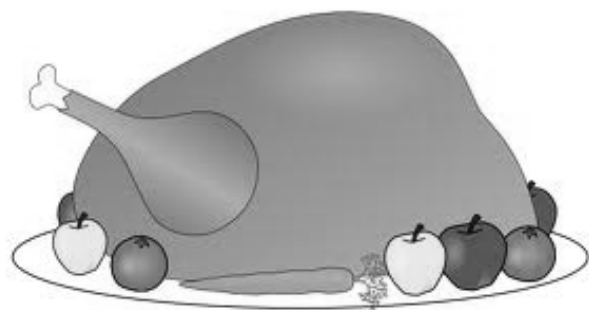

From the Superintendent, Chris Love Golf Course Superintendent

It is hard to believe that it is already November, but I guess it sure is. It may just be me, but it seems like the last couple of months have really flown by. The month of October was pretty busy for us maintaining the golf course. We did a lot of seeding on the golf course, and are starting to see quite a bit of grass coming up around the course. Besides that, it has mostly been just trying to keep up with the falling leaves throughout the golf course, but I am sure that just about everyone here in Doe Valley can relate to that.

The month of November typically relates to a slow down for us, but we still have plenty of things to do. The weather can be rather unpredictable this time of year, so it is hard to tell how many good golfing days there are left this season. While the number of "golfing" days typically begins to lessen because of the weather, we have an opportunity to do some things this time of year that we can't do in-season. This will include plenty of tree-work, including removing some trees and trimming others. We have begun some other projects that we hope to be able to finish soon as well.

One thing that will be noticeable this time of year as you play or just pass by the golf course is the fairways turning brown. Don't be alarmed, as this is totally normal for the type of grass we have in our fairways. Bermudagrass is a warm season grass, and as such, goes dormant for the winter months. As the weather gets colder and the daylight hours get shorter, the plant "shuts down" for the winter. Since the plants are not actively growing, any damage that these plants sustain will be evident throughout the winter months and into the spring, until the grass comes out of dormancy. That being said, we often times err on the side of caution when it comes to allowing cart traffic on the fairways, in order to reduce the potential for damage. As I mentioned last month, frost is also a major concern this time of year. Those white mornings will be coming much more frequently in the coming weeks, so we just ask that you bear with us on these days.

All that being said, I would encourage everyone to take advantage of the golf days we have remaining for the year. It sure is a beautiful time of year, as the foliage changes, to get out and enjoy the outdoors. What better way to do that than by playing a round of golf on your home golf course!
