from the General Manager

WE EXTEND OUR CONDOLENCES TO THE SHIPLEY FAMILY WITH THE PASSING OF MARJORIE. JOHN AND MARGE HAVE LIVED ON RED PINE CT. IN PINE POINT FOR MANY YEARS.

1. ANNUAL MEETING: The Annual meeting will be Tuesday, June 7th at 7:30 in the S&T Club dining room. Results of the election will be announced at this meeting.

2. WWTP: Progress continues but slowly because of the continual rain, hopefully running by the end of summer.

3. INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION: Will be on SATURDAY, JULY 2nd this year. The fun begins at the pool at noon. The Club has several activities planned for the day: The boat parade will be in the afternoon and a picnic style buffet dinner at the S&T dining room that evening; fireworks should go off close to 10pm. Pool opens at Noon and the lifeguards will have games planned throughout the day. **BRING YOUR ID OR POOL MEMBERSHIP CARDS**

4. POOL: The pool will be open as of this writing. Closed Tuesday the 31st; open up on Wednesday the 1st of June then on regular schedule. **SUMMER HOURS 12:00PM TILL 7PM TUE.-SUN.; FRIDAYS UNTIL 9PM;** closed on Mondays. Make sure you bring your ID or Pool Membership Card to the pool so the lifeguards can identify you as a member. Water aerobics begins the first Monday in June.

6. DAYCAMPS: We are trying to work out the details with Camp Piomingo to have our kids spend a longer day on Thursdays in order to experience more activities. The only holdup is how to proceed with lunch arrangements in each venue. Hopefully this will be worked out in the next week or two just before you get this mailing. When calling to sign up your kids for day camp, we will advise how we worked out the lunches on Thursdays.

5. YARD MAINTENANCE: Everyone, including, **RENTERS**, have a responsibility to keep their yards mowed and lots cleared of debris, garbage, clutter etc. If I have to send the Maintenance crew out to clean up your lot; you won't like the price you'll be charged.

**MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
DOE VALLEY ASSOCIATION INC.
Friday, April 29, 2016
10:00 A.M. at the Doe Valley Administration Office**

Member's present: Lloyd McCollum, Terry Mattingly, Gregory Hurt, Stuart Pepper, Eddie Sipes, and Ken Wilson, General Manager.

Lloyd established a quorum and the meeting came to order at 10:00 A.M. Lloyd called for the acceptance of the minutes from the previous meeting. Greg reminded the Board that an email motion (16-04-002) to accept the March meeting minutes were unanimously approved on April 5th. He also listed all the required meetings for the next quarter.

January Financials: Patsy reminded the Board of the email she sent with her report for their review. She briefed that the 2015 Audit has been completed, and that the report will be ready in a few weeks. She began with the financials listing that the administration income is lower than what the Board had budgeted. Ken stated that the first quarter has historically been lower. Patsy showed the Board that the financials have a new section titled Real Estate. Ken informed the Board that his intent is: if we accept a lot back in lieu of delinquent dues, he feels that the closing cost and taxes will be paid by the member and not Doe Valley. The Board adamantly agreed. Patsy also highlighted that operating expenses are slightly higher than what was budgeted. She said that it was the sewer line repairs that amounts to the majority of operating expenses. She ended her briefing on a positive note with praising the S&T Club; the S&T Club is \$7,500 better than what was projected, and \$10,800 better than the same time in 2015. The Board stated that those are encouraging numbers. Greg commented that a red flag up for him is that income is down and operating expenses are up. He asked the group for options; with nothing concrete suggested. Ken declared that he is providing the services that the members desire, and expect to receive. He believes that everything he is doing or has done is for the betterment of Doe Valley. He further stated that it costs money to maintain Doe Valley. If we plan on attracting new members we must maintain it, if not improve certain aspects that make Doe Valley such a wonderful place to live. Greg recommended that Doe Valley offer a payoff of the Lake and Golf Course assessment, sort of in line with the way Doe Valley offered the WWTP assessment. However, the amount will only be used to pay off the loan for the Lake and Golf Course assessment. It would not be used for operating expenses. Lloyd wanted to see the numbers (how the calculation is going to be done) before calling for the vote on the subject. Ken stated, if the objective is to get out from underneath the debt; then it is a good thing. With no further questions pertaining to the March financials, Lloyd moved the discussion to the special guest Mr. Darren Sipes.

Past due delinquencies; Attorney Darren Sipes assisted Doe Valley in obtaining a judgement against Doe Valley Real Estate Corporation (owned by Shannon Keim). He attended our meeting to discuss options for collecting the judgement we have been awarded. Several ideas were discussed and negotiations will continue. Mr. Darren Sipes was thanked for his time, and Lloyd moved the discussion to the General Manager's report.

General Manager's Report: Ken reminded the Board of the email he sent with the report for their review. He informed the Board whom has submitted their resumes for Board of Director: Mr. Eddie Sipes, and Mr. Charles Kitchen. Lloyd volunteered to be the Director who will oversee the Election Committee. Greg asked Ken for a decision on whether or not he is going to extend his contract. Ken stated his plan is to retire around May 2017. He reassured the Board that no matter when he officially decides, he will give the Board at least 90-days' notice. He updated the Board on the progress of the WWTP.

He continued, the Division of Water inspector visited our WWTP, and he was very impressed with this new system. He will bring a group over to tour it, as it is the future of WWTP construction. The contractor building the plant is planning to be there also to promote it. The inspector was so impressed with the life cycle of the plant and the lower operating cost associated with it. His comment was in line with "why haven't other municipalities developed this kind of plant". A 50 year life expectancy, and a 20 year maintenance of associated parts is a great selling point. Ken continued with his report, if Doe Valley does take lots back in lieu of what is owed, he feels that it should not cost Doe Valley anything. Therefore, he asked the Board for a decision, if Doe Valley takes back lots it should not be responsible for past due taxes, nor closing cost associated with it. The Board agreed, no property Doe Valley acquires should come with any cost to Doe Valley, such as back taxes, closing costs, and the like. Ken informed the Board that the Standpipe has been taken off-line and the Estates section water pressure has improved. Ken finished his report with announcing that he will be looking for another Marina manager; John Brangers will be moving in June. With no further questions pertaining to the General Manager's report Lloyd moved the discussion to old business.

Old Business:

Combination of lots; Lloyd reminded the Board of the e-mail conversation pertaining to this issue. He also confirmed that when Doe Valley purchased the Lake and Golf Course that the number of lots being calculated was around 1,200 lots. However, today it is close to 1,000 lots. Therefore, what the General Manager has been proposing is justified. The Board should not expect the General Manager to perform at the same level on less money. A heated debate began amongst the Board. Greg stated that the Board has two subjects that need to be debated separately 1) Stop the policy allowing the combination of lots of three or more and, 2) Allowing current combined lots to separate with the detached lot large enough to build a home. He recommended that we hear from the members at the Town Hall before a decision is made.

Policy for non-compliance (docks/boats); Greg reminded the Board of the e-mail conversation pertaining to this subject. He did research the rules, and explained that the only real change to the current rules is the requirement to label ones dock with their lot number. Lloyd biggest concern is the enforcement of the rule. Greg stated the rules already have enough teeth in them and that each case and/or offense would be considered on a case by case basis. The published rules state: Penalties may consist of reasonable fines or suspension of privileges in facilities as may appear to be appropriate in the circumstance. Citations will be written thirty (30) days after a warning citation is issued. Owners may receive a certified letter notifying them of the warning citation and the consequences that will follow. The amount of the fine will be added each month until the issue has been brought into compliance. After a fine or warning is issued, a member may appeal the decision in writing via e-mail to the Compliance Committee. Lloyd stated the objective of this new rule change is to ensure everyone using our lake, and is helping us maintain it. If you want to use our facilities then help us maintain them; this includes the lake. The Board approved the addition to the rule on dock labeling with the member's lot number, and Greg will update the rules.

Advertising for Real Estate; Greg provided an update on the e-mail conversation pertaining to this issue. He also provided his research on lot pricing. He questioned how many times it was posted on Craigslist and how much response we have gotten. Ken stated he posted it once, and will renew the posting every thirty days. However, he has not received any calls on the one posting. Greg requested that Ken post it once a week to keep it in the front of the list. Greg educated the Board on that most on-line searches only goes to the third page; then they move on to another subject. He also requested that Ken post what the Board approved as the advertising; that included the four P's of marketing (Product, Price, Place, and Promotion). Lloyd inquired on whether or not we could list on a MLS, but this would require a real estate license. He continued, we need to partner with several real estate agents that live with-in Doe Valley and come up with a plan of action. Eddie provided his assessment of this, and educated the Board on the very serious rules associated with it. Ken will contact several agents and seek ideas and/or options available and report back to the Board.

Five Year Strategic Plan; Greg reviewed the e-mail conversation that the Board had on this subject; then listed the plan. The Board approved the 2016 Five Year Strategic Plan:

1. Repave the roads as necessary and ensure the striping is maintained for safe driving.
2. Repair and replace sewer pumping stations.
3. Replace several sewer lines in the Estates; that are deteriorating due to age.
4. Repair and replace aging Vehicle fleet.
5. Rebuild the west beach by landscaping and the installation of a retaining wall to hold the hillside.
6. S&T club renovation; flooring, expanding bar area.
7. Irrigation water system on the golf course; continual.
8. Repair and expand docks at the Marina; subject to authorized waiting list and funding.

Planning Objectives:

1. Short-Term Objectives (1 – 5 years)

- A. Refurbish sewer pump stations (one per year)
- B. Repair and Replace Fleet Vehicles (continual)
- C. Repair/Expand Docks at Marina (2018)
- D. Golf Course self-sufficient (2018)
- F. S&T Club self-sufficient (2019)

2. Long-Term Objectives (6 – 10 years)

- A. Maintain roads, infrastructure and utilities to a high standard.

1) Clean and quality water supply.

2) Efficient and effective disposal of waste.

- B. Explore revenue sources that reduce reliance on dues, fees, and assessments.

- C. Review of dues, fees, and creative financing techniques.

1) Involves the constant monitoring of ways for Doe Valley to save money whether through increase operation efficiencies, debt restructuring or other creative cost saving measures.

2) Plan for a balance budget.

- D. Provide a safe environment for residents and visitors.

New Business:

Manpower for Real Estate Sales; Greg reminded the Board of the e-mail conversation on this subject. Ken began with “it takes money to make money”. He provided an example of what he had done, and the enthusiasm displayed when he stated they could make a little extra money, if and when a lot was sold. He also cautioned the Board it takes time and effort to sell Doe Valley. He proclaimed the incentives has to be there for the employee to spend their time away from what we have hired them to do, and expect them do it at the current level. Either the Board needs to bring in an outside source, or let them receive an incentive for their efforts. The Board agreed that an incentive is the way to go currently. However, Greg asked for specifics such as a commission base, a flat fee, or a combination. Lloyd did not want to commit to anything until he heard from the professional agents, all agreed.

Roundtable of Director's: Terry began with the Advisory Council concerns, specifically ATV use on the roadways. The Board stated it is against the rules, and there are no plans to change them to allow ATV's or golf carts on the roadways. These roads are under the Commonwealth of Kentucky jurisdiction and the residence must abide by their laws.

Review of the meeting:

The Board updated the rule that makes it a requirement to label ones dock on the lake.

The Board approved the Five Year Strategic Plan.

The next Board meeting is tentatively scheduled for May 27, 2016 at 10:00 A.M.

Adjourn: Terry made a motion (16-04-003) to adjourn, seconded by Greg, meeting adjourned.
